**RULES**

In addition to the general adult home economics department rules: Exhibitor must provide own coat hangers and cover (if desired). Exhibitor must remove any personal identification. **Soiled items will not be judged.**

**SPECIAL AWARDS**

The Catherine Hatfield Memorial Award, sponsored by the Washington County Extension Homemakers Council, is a cash award of \$10 presented to the Grand Champion.

The Washington County Farm Bureau Women’s Committee will present Sweepstakes Awards of \$25, \$20, and \$15 to the three persons having the highest number of points in the adult clothing department, with a minimum of 5 points to qualify. Points will be equal to premium money earned. Members of the Farm Bureau Women’s Committee are not eligible.

**The Farm Bureau Sew With Cotton class** is for 100% cotton fabric garments, with thread and trim of cotton or cotton blend. Bring a swatch of fabric from garment that is entered in the Sew With Cotton Contest at the Washington County Fair. Different winners may be selected in each contest category: 1) Cotton Suit; 2) Cotton Dress; 3) Cotton Sportswear; 4) Special Category. The garment that wins in category 1) Cotton Suite, 2) Cotton Dress, 3) Cotton Sportswear, 4) Special Category at the 2010 Washington County Fair, must be the same garment that is entered in the State Sew with Cotton Contest. The garment may also be entered in one of the regular fair classes for possible premium money, in addition to the “Sew With Cotton” class. The winner is eligible to be the official county representative in the adult division at the Arkansas Farm Bureau Sew With Cotton Contest in December 2010. That contest requires the seamstress to model the garment, so it must be made by the seamstress for herself/himself. Washington County Farm Bureau will provide overnight accommodation expenses (room for 1 night, \$25 meal allotment and round trip mileage from Fayetteville) for the winner. County awards will be given at the Washington County Fair Awards Program, Saturday, September 4<sup>th</sup> at 5:30 p.m.

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GENERAL APPEARANCE.....	25	_____
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- Garment is clean and well pressed.
- Markings do not show on right side.
- Garment looks smooth, without puckers or pulls.
- Fabric is suitable to garment design and purpose.
- Combination of fabric and trims is suitable.
- Selection of notions (zipper, hooks, snaps, buttons, etc.) is appropriate

CUTTING.....	15	_____
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- Garment is cut on grain.
- Plaids or stripes are well matched at side seams, center front, center back and sleeves.
- Fitted facings are cut on same grain as corresponding part of garment.
- Nap or one-way design is cut in one direction.

SEAMING.....	20	_____
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- Stitch tension and length is appropriate for fabric.
- Seams are of even width and pressed correctly.
- Darts are stitched to taper in a straight line to nothing at the point and are correctly pressed.
- Seam finish is appropriate for fabric and garment design.
- Serged seam finish has balanced tension and thread matches or blends with fabric.
- Enclosed seams are clipped, trimmed and graded to at least ¼ inch width.
- Facing is under stitched and edge is tacked to the garment seam lines.
- Underarm seam is reinforced with a second row of stitching and trimmed to ¼ inch.
- Crotch seam is stitched as one seam joining two legs and is reinforced and trimmed in curved areas.

GARMENT DETAILS.....20

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- Gathers are evenly distributed.
- Corners and points are smooth, even and match corresponding corners and points in size and shape.
- Suitable interfacing used in necessary area of garment (collar, under buttons and buttonholes, waistband, etc.)
- Collar is smooth and rolls well.
- Undercollar does not show on upper side of collar.
- Fullness across top of sleeve is evenly distributed.
- Set-in sleeve cap is smooth and without puckers.
- Waistband is even in width and appropriately treated for fabric and garment style.
- Trims are applied securely and inconspicuously.
- Pockets are smooth and appropriately stitched.
- Top stitching is well placed and straight.

CLOSURE.....10

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- Buttonholes are an appropriate style, well made, the same length and the same distance from opening edge.
- Buttons are sewn on with a thread shank (unless the button has a shank) and are aligned with buttonholes.
- Zipper plackets are smooth, even in width, and appropriate for type of openings.
- Zipper teeth are well concealed.
- Appropriately attached fasteners used to supplement the zipper.

HEMS.....10

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- Hem edges are appropriately finished for fabric and garment style.
- Hems are appropriate width, turned up evenly & fullness is evenly eased to fit the garment.
- Hem stitches are securely sewn an equal distance apart and invisible on the right side.
