General Rules

Exhibitors

Exhibitors must be a registered 4-H or FFA member who has not graduated from high school. The following counties may participate: Benton, Conway, Crawford, Faulkner, Franklin, Johnson, Logan, Madison, Perry, Pope, Scott, Sebastian, Washington, and Yell.

Registration Instructions and Fees (Entries must be received by April 1.)

Direct questions to the Washington County Extension Office, (479)444-1755. Fairgrounds will be open on Friday for early arrival.

Expenses will be deducted from entry fees. The remaining money will be added to the allocated \$4,000 premium, allowing us to pay more in prize money.

Weigh In

All livestock must be in place by 9:00am Saturday, April 9. Market animals, including steers and lambs, will officially weigh in Saturday, April 9 beginning at 9:00am. Release times will be announced by department superintendents. (See special rules on entry and release times for rabbits, and poultry.)

Exhibitors must show their own animals unless they have multiple animals in the ring(s) at the same time.

Bedding

Bedding will not be furnished. Beef, Goat and Sheep exhibitors must bring their own shavings. Straw is not allowed in barns.

Exhibition Livestock Health Regulations

Disease

Animals showing evidence of infectious or contagious disease, external parasitism, active ringworm lesions, multiple warts that are easily visible without close examination, or atrophic rhinitis may not participate.

Species Requirements

Animals entering the fairgrounds must meet the requirements of their particular species.

Certificate of Veterinary Inspection

Arkansas livestock (except for Arkansas sheep and steers) must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within 90 days prior to exhibition. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is a legible record (made on an official form issued from the state of origin) by an accredited veterinarian, which shows that the animal listed thereon meets health requirements of the state of destination. It must bear the identification of each animal. Separate certificates are required for each species of animal entered. The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection must show the following:

Arkansas Cattle

- Since Arkansas is a class-free state, Arkansas cattle are exempt from brucellosis testing.
- Heifers 4-12 months of age must be vaccinated.
- Heifers over 12 months old, born on or after January 1, 1985, must be vaccinated unless they are from a Certified Brucellosis-Free Herd.

- Steers are not required to have a health certificate, but all animals will be examined and must be free of any transmissible disease. Steers are not required to be tested for brucellosis or tuberculosis.

Sheep and Goats

Sheep or goats showing clinical symptoms of scrapie will immediately be quarantined and required to undergo any approved diagnostic tests. The animal will be consigned to slaughter or destruction with submission of tissues to an approved diagnostic laboratory at the exhibitor's expense.

Commingleing (as defined by the Arkansas Scrapie Regulation) of sheep or goats of different flock status (as defined by the Voluntary Flock Certification Program) is prohibited and must be reported to the VFCP state official and State Veterinarian.

Sheep or goats showing symptoms of disease, particularly foot rot, sore mouth, sheep pox, evidence of fungal infection, evidence of abscesses or draining abscesses, may not participate. These animals may be released by fair officials, veterinarians, and state or federal personnel.

Sheep

Sheep must be tagged with a Scrapie Identification Tag upon arrival at the fairgrounds. If your sheep are from a Certified Scrapie-Free Herd, advise the Superintendent and they will be penned accordingly.

Sheep will be inspected on the fairgrounds. Sheep showing symptoms of foot-rot or wool fungus may not participate.

Dairy Goats

Registered dairy goats entering the fairgrounds must be accompanied by a registration certificate (in exhibitor's name) with matching permanent identification.

Unregistered goats must be tagged with a Scrapie Identification Tag upon arrival at the fairgrounds.

If your goats are from a Certified Scrapie-Free Herd, advise the Superintendent and they will be penned accordingly.

Health certificates will not be required, but goats may be examined on grounds by fair personnel, veterinarians, and state or federal personnel. Goats showing evidence of disease may be released.

Rabbits

Health certificates will not be required for rabbits, but they must be free of disease with no ear mites or sore hocks.

Poultry

An official representing the person sponsoring the exhibition must notify the State Veterinarian no later than 30 days prior to the exhibition, giving the names, place, inclusive dates and times of the event. The requirements for exhibition are as follows:

Pullorum-Typhoid Status

All poultry, including turkeys but excluding waterfowl must have originated from U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid clean flocks, equivalent flocks, or have had a negative Pullorum-Typhoid test within 90 days of the exhibition. This information will be documented on an NPIP form VS9-3, NPIP form VS9-2, or similar certificate and must accompany the poultry during the exhibition.

Poultry showing evidence of infectious or contagious disease or insect infestation may not participate.

Record Keeping

The exhibition sponsor must compile a list of all poultry present at the exhibition. The list must contain the name and addresses of each owner, the number, the species, breed, variety, type, sex and Pullorum-Typhoid status. A copy of this list will be retained by the exhibition sponsor for at least 12 months.

1. Animals must be registered and owned by exhibitors.
2. Exhibitors will be limited to two entries per class.
3. Animals in this section must comply with health regulations and all other rules outlines in the general rules.

Identification Tags

1. Registered goats entering fairgrounds must be accompanied by a registration certificate (in exhibitor's name) with matching permanent identification.
2. Unregistered goats must be tagged with a Scrapie Identification Tag upon arrival.
3. If your goats are from a Certified Scrapie-Free Herd, advise the Superintendent and they will be penned accordingly.

Special Rules

1. The base date for computing ages is the date of the show.
2. Exhibitors will be limited to two entries per class.
3. Only does will be shown. Bucks over two months old are not allowed at the fairgrounds.
4. Check-in for senior does is Friday, April 8 by 8:00pm; junior does must be in place by 9:00 am Saturday, April 9. The Superintendent will verify registration certificates. Tattoos may be checked. Original registration certificates are required for all does six months or older. Original registration certificates or duplicate applications stamped by the registration office are required for all does under six months of age that were bred and are owned by the exhibitor. A doe not bred by the exhibitor must be owned by the exhibitor 45 days prior to show. Bring the registration certificate or Bill of Sale to check-in.
5. There will be a pre-show milkout at 8:30pm Friday night under the supervision of the Superintendent and/or an appointed committee. Goats not milked out will not be allowed to show.
6. American Dairy Goat Association rules will apply in cases not covered by rules and regulations herein.
7. Exhibitors should be neatly and appropriately dressed. ADGA prefers white when showing in the ring.
8. Check general rules for health requirements, entry fees, due dates, etc.
9. Horned animals will not be allowed at the fairgrounds.
10. Dairy Goats will show following the sheep.

2. Registration certificates must be available for inspection at the show and the animals must wear the association ear tag or the breeder's ear tag.
3. Sheep must be tagged with a Scrapie Identification Tag upon arrival at the fairgrounds. If your sheep are from a Certified Scrapie-Free Herd, advise the Superintendent and they will be penned accordingly.
4. Exhibitors may not enter more than two entries per class.
5. Sheep will begin showing Saturday at 10:00am.
6. General rules apply to this section relative to entry fees and time of entries.
7. Hay is not allowed in pens.
8. Sheep showing symptoms of foot-rot or wool fungus may not be penned or shown.

Special Rules

1. Animals entered in the breeding classes must be registered in the exhibitor's name.
2. Registration certificates must be available for inspection at the show. Ear tattoos will be verified prior to showing.
3. Junior breeding beef must be owned by the exhibitor.
4. Animals entered in the breeding classes are subject to mousing. Any animal found to be over age for its class will be banned from competition.
5. General rules on health requirements must be observed.
6. There will be classes for all recognized breeds.
7. Straw is not allowed in the beef barn.
8. The show will begin at 12:00 noon.
9. The show will proceed in the following order: (1) Breeding Heifers and bulls in alphabetical order, (2) Commercial Heifers, (3) Steers, (4) Showmanship

Section EE: Prospect Steers

Special Rules

1. Market steers will officially weigh in Saturday, April 9 beginning at 9:00am. The minimum weight for prospect steers is 600 pounds. Lighter animals will not be accepted.
2. Exhibitors will be limited to two steers per class.
3. Bulls, stags, or horned steers may not participate.
4. Steers of breeding beef are eligible to show.
5. Steers must have all baby teeth in evidence at the time of the show.
6. Steers will be shown in six classes based on their official show weights without regard to breed. An equal number of steers will be put into classes whenever possible.
7. A sifting committee will check all steers. Undesirable animals, as determined by the committee, must be removed from the fairgrounds. The committee will consist of two show chairmen and the general livestock superintendent of the show.
8. General rules apply to this section.

Section EEE: Commercial Heifer Information

Special Rules

1. Commercial heifers are defined as any female that is not registered. All animals must be crossbred. Purebred animals are not eligible to show.
2. Animals will be weighed and classified as American, British, or Exotic. Classes will be divided by weight and classification. Classes within each group will be determined after entries are in place.
3. Animals must be born after April 1, 2009.
4. A Champion and Reserve Champion will be chosen.
5. Commercial heifers must be weaned; no nurse cows.

Showmanship Classes (ribbons only, no premiums)

Animals used in showmanship classes must be owned by the exhibitor and be shown in a class in addition to showmanship. Pee Wee Youth are not required to own their contest animal.

Section F: Poultry

Special Rules

1. Pigeons, waterfowl and guineas may not participate.
2. Birds will be accepted Friday, April 8 from 7:00pm - 9:00pm and must be in place by 9:00am Saturday, April 9.
3. Birds will be released by Superintendent following show.
4. See the entry and health requirements under *General Rules*.
5. Exhibitors are limited to two entries per class.
6. Pullet chain birds (white leghorn/golden sex link) from previous years may not be shown.
7. If there is no competition within a class, placing is at the discretion of the judge.
